Her majertys Greasury have again had under consideration your letter of the 7° farmary 1893 submitting a resolution passed by the Board of Governors & Greandians of the National Gallery of Ireland in favour of adding 10% to the wages of the National Gallery Porters.

Eto per annum, Together with uniforms

and escha pay (2/6) for Sunday attendance, and the Benior Porter is provided with rooms, fuel and light.

Their Lordships cannot admit that any fair comparison can be drawn between the wages of these Porters of those of the attendants in the Ednibuys, or the Porters in the Lordon, Gallerin; but having regard to the pay of the Porters employed in private establishments in bublin such as the Bank of Ireland and the Royal Bank, they are of spinion that, even after taking into account the shorter hours of attendance in the National Gallery, a fair care can be made out for an improvement in the wages of the present staff of Porters in your Department.

At the same time Their Loraships observe that whereas the two Psanks in question imploy Government Pensioners Soleh, your Department imploys now.
